Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 14 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: To what extent does the domain gap between synthetic first-person videos and real-world footage impact the robustness of training-free multimodal action recognition models on standard benchmarks. 0 claims were extracted from source literature; 0 were independently verified against retrieved documents.
