

# Federated Vision-Language Model Convergence Under Compression and Communication Frequency Trade-offs

## Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 12 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: What is the impact of communication round frequency on the convergence speed and final inference throughput of federated vision-language models when using near-optimal compression versus QSGD. This paper provides an overview of the Internet of Things (IoT) with emphasis on enabling technologies, protocols, and application issues. The IoT is enabled by the latest developments in RFID, smart sensors, communication technologies, and Internet protocols. 8 claims were extracted from source literature; 7 were independently verified against retrieved documents. ## 1 Introduction
