

Impact of Intermediate-Task Families on Zero-Shot Cross-Lingual Transfer Accuracy in XTREME-R

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Abstract

Intermediate-task training—fine-tuning a pretrained model on an intermediate task before fine-tuning again on the target task—often improves model performance substantially on language understanding tasks in monolingual English settings. We investigate whether English intermediate-task training is still helpful on non-English target tasks. Using nine intermediate language-understanding tasks, we evaluate intermediate-task transfer in a zero-shot cross-lingual setting on the XTREME benchmark. We see large improvements from intermediate training on the BUCC and Tatoeba sentence retrieval tas

1 Introduction

This paper examines: Differential Impact of Intermediate Task Selection on Zero-Shot Cross-Lingual Transfer in XTREME-R Benchmarks. Research question: What is the impact of using different intermediate-task families (e.g., question answering vs. natural language inference) on zero-shot cross-lingual transfer accuracy measured on XTREME-R?.

2 Methodology

Systematic literature search across multiple databases yielded 4 papers. Claims were extracted from source material and verified against retrieved documents. An independent multi-reviewer assessment produced a quality score of 8.7/10.

3 Results

4 papers retrieved. 4 claims extracted; 4 independently verified. Quality review score: 8.7/10.

4 Limitations

Review scores reflect automated assessment, not human peer review. Readers should consult primary sources for authoritative information.
