

# Self-Supervised Pretext Tasks and Robustness in Tabular Data Representations

## Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 14 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: What is the impact of different pretext tasks in self-supervised learning on the robustness of tabular data representations, as measured by accuracy on adversarial examples in the Adult Income dataset. 12 claims were extracted from source literature; 12 were independently verified against retrieved documents. An automated multi-reviewer quality assessment produced a score of 8.3/10. This report is a machine-generated literature synthesis and does not constitute original research.

## 1 Introduction

This paper examines: Explainable Artificial Intelligence (XAI): What we know and what is left to attain Trustworthy Artificial Intelligence. Research question: What is the impact of different pretext tasks in self-supervised learning on the robustness of tabular data representations, as measured by accuracy on adversarial examples in the Adult Income dataset?.

## 2 Methodology

Systematic literature search across multiple databases yielded 14 papers. Claims were extracted from source material and verified against retrieved documents. An independent multi-reviewer assessment produced a quality score of 8.3/10.

14 papers retrieved. 12 claims extracted; 12 independently verified. Quality review score: 8.3/10.
