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Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 14 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: To what extent does leveraging one-to-many image-text relationships during training reduce fairness disparity metrics in multimodal models subjected to spectral adversarial attacks. 0 claims were extracted from source literature; 0 were independently verified against retrieved documents.
