Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 14 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: Can large pre-trained video encoders trained solely on synthetic data achieve competitive top-1 accuracy on the Something-Something V2 benchmark compared to models fine-tuned on real footage. 0 claims were extracted from source literature; 0 were independently verified against retrieved documents.
