Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 14 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: How does adaptive context selection impact answer accuracy on the NarrativeQA dataset compared to fixed-window retrieval strategies for aggregation questions. 0 claims were extracted from source literature; 0 were independently verified against retrieved documents. An automated multi-reviewer quality assessment produced a score of 5.7/10. This report is a machine-generated literature synthesis and does not constitute original research.

1 Introduction

This paper examines: Evaluating Multi-Hop Reasoning in RAG Systems: A Comparison of LLM-Based Retriever Evaluation Strategies. 2 Methodology
