

# Synthetic Caption Entropy and Few-Shot Classification in Out-of-Distribution Remote Sensing

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## Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 4 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: How does varying the entropy of synthetic vision-language captions affect few-shot classification accuracy on out-of-distribution remote sensing datasets. 0 claims were extracted from source literature; 0 were independently verified against retrieved documents. An automated multi-reviewer quality assessment produced a score of 3.7/10. This report is a machine-generated literature synthesis and does not constitute original research.

## 1 Introduction

This paper examines: Remote Sensing SpatioTemporal Vision-Language Models: A Comprehensive Survey. Research question: How does varying the entropy of synthetic vision-language captions affect few-shot classification accuracy on out-of-distribution remote sensing datasets?.

## 2 Methodology

Systematic literature search across multiple databases yielded 4 papers. Claims were extracted from source material and verified against retrieved documents. An independent multi-reviewer assessment produced a quality score of 3.7/10.
