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Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 13 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: Does early-layer LoRA fine-tuning with Targeted Lexical Injection improve cross-lingual natural language inference accuracy on XNLI for Bantu languages more effectively than adapter-based methods. 0 claims were extracted from source literature; 0 were independently verified against retrieved documents. An automated multi-reviewer quality assessment produced a score of 5.3/10. This report is a machine-generated literature synthesis and does not constitute original research.

1 Introduction

2 Methodology
