Abstract

This report synthesises findings from 8 peer-reviewed papers addressing the following research question: How does BSFA's exact query-key selection scale in throughput and accuracy compared to sparse attention mechanisms like Reformer and Linformer when applied to conversational benchmarks (e.g., 0 claims were extracted from source literature; 0 were independently verified against retrieved documents. 1 Introduction
